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DANIELA BERNACCHI

Executive Director, UN Global Compact Network Italy

After nearly twenty-year career in the marketing of large and distinguished multinationals operating in the publishing, entertainment, and energy sectors Bernacchi continued her professional experience in the non-profit sector.

Until February 2019 she was CEO of two leading Italian NGOs, namely WeWorld and then Cesvi, focusing on humanitarian and development programs. She was also member of the Board of «Alliance2015», a network which brings together 8 European NGOs.

Since September 2019 she is Executive Director of UN Global Compact Network Italy, the world's largest voluntary corporate sustainability initiative in the world. From 2020 to March 2022, she covered the position of Alternate to the Chair of the Western Europe countries for UNGC. In the same period she joined the Sustainability Advisory board of Edison until December 22. Since November 2022 she has been appointed board member at Snam Foundation engaging on energy, education and food poverty.



ALESSANDRO BERNINI

CEO, Maire Tecnimont

He started his professional career in 1979 dealing with auditing. In 1980 he joined Ernst & Young and during his internal career he deals with the auditing of important national (Saipem, Pirelli) and international groups as well as the technical aspects of auditing and accounting, participating in the development of auditing standards and supporting the National Council of Certified Public Accountants in the drafting of the first formulation of the National Accounting Principles.

He was appointed Partner in 1994 and took the responsibility for the office located in Brescia while continuing to maintain responsibility for important forensic engagements of the Milan central office.

In 1996 he joined the Saipem Group (ENI group) as Chief Financial Officer and, since 2002, he has been also appointed Head of the Corporate Secretary and Corporate Governance.

During his tenure at Saipem he actively participated in 2000 in the acquisition of the group listed on the Paris and New York stock exchanges Bouygues Offshore and of the Snamprogetti group in 2006. In 2008 he was called to assume the role of Chief Financial Officer of the ENI Group, which he held until December 2012. During his mandate at Eni, he coordinated the activities aimed to the sale of participation in Snam group to Cassa Depositi e Prestiti, the acquisitions of international companies operating in the Oil & Gas sector and the sale of the investment held by Eni in the Portuguese national energy company Galp. He represented Eni in Snam Board of Directors, Chairman of Eni Insurance and member of OIL Board of Directors, this last an insurance company established among the international oil companies.

In 2013 he joined Maire Tecnimont Group as Group Chief Financial Officer, also covering the position of Director in several Group Companies.

Since May 2022 he has been holding the position of Chief Executive Officer of Maire Tecnimont SpA, as well as of the subsidiaries Tecnimont S.p.A., KT Kinetics Technologies S.p.A. and NextChem S.p.A.

He is registered in the National Register of Auditors since April 1995 and qualified to the profession of Certified Accountant since 1994. He attended as visiting Professor in the Accounting Master at the University of Pavia from 1998 to 2000 and in 2008.



MARKUS BEYRER

Director General, BusinessEurope

Markus J. Beyrer has been Director General of BUSINESSEUROPE since 2013.

Prior to this he held the positions of CEO of the Austrian Industry Holding ÖIAG, Director General of the Federation of Austrian Industries (IV) and Director for Economic Affairs of the Austrian Federal Economic Chamber.

Before this Mr Beyrer served as Chief Economic Advisor to the Federal Chancellor of the Republic of Austria, Dr. Wolfgang Schüssel.

In the 1990s he worked on Austria's accession to the European Union and the integration of Austria into the European Single Market (at the Austrian Permanent Representation to the European Union and the European Commission).

In addition to his executive positions, Mr Beyrer held a number of non-executive board functions in various Austrian industrial companies and was a member of the non- executive board of the Austrian Central Bank.

Mr Beyrer read Law and Commercial Sciences in Vienna, graduating in Law at the University of Vienna. Later he completed postgraduate studies in European Law at the Danube University in Krems (Austria) and the Stanford Executive Program at the Graduate School of Business at Stanford University.



FATIH BIROL

Executive Director, International Energy Agency - IEA

Dr Fatih Birol has served as Executive Director of the International Energy Agency since 2015. Under his leadership, the IEA has moved to the forefront of global efforts to reach international climate goals, safeguard energy security and manage the social and economic impacts of clean energy transitions.

Dr Birol took up his current position after rising through the ranks of the IEA, starting as a junior analyst in the mid-1990s and eventually serving as Chief Economist responsible for the IEA's flagship World Energy Outlook.

Dr Birol has been named in the TIME100, TIME's annual list of the world's most influential people. He has also been named by Forbes as one of the most influential people in the world of energy and by the Financial Times as the Energy Personality of the Year. He chairs the World Economic Forum's (Davos) Energy Advisory Board.

Before the IEA, Dr Birol worked at the Organisation of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) in Vienna. He earned a BSc degree in power engineering from the Technical University of Istanbul and received an MSc and PhD in energy economics from the Technical University of Vienna. He is an honorary life member of Galatasaray Football Club.



LORENZO BOTTINELLI

CEO, *Basf Italy*

Born in Como in 1973, Lorenzo Bottinelli earned a degree in chemistry from the State University of Milan in 1998 and then completed an MBA at SDA Bocconi in 2002.

Lorenzo has worked for BASF for many years, first joining the company in 2000 in the Coatings Division. Initially, he was involved with the logistics side, but in 2007 he became the Key Account Manager FIAT Group Europe and Local BU Manager, overseeing key clients in the automotive industry in Europe and Asia.

In 2010, he moved to BTC, a Group company that focuses on distributing speciality chemicals to small and medium-sized businesses. He rose to become the General Manager for Italy and Greece. In 2017, he was appointed as Commercial Director for BASF Italia S.p.A., taking on the role of Global Key Account Team Leader for the BASF Group for FCA (Fiat Chrysler Automobiles). Since March 2020, he is Vice President BASF Group Italy and CEO BASF Italia S.p.A.

Member of the Presidency Council of Federchimica with responsibility for the Circular Economy.

President of PlasticsEurope Italia. In Confindustria he is a member of the Environment Technical Committee, member of the Advisory Board for Foreign Investors and of the Foreign Companies Observatory. Vice President of the Italian-German Chamber of Commerce (AHK Italien) and member of the AHK CEO-Group with chair in the Steering Committee for the Circular Economy. In Assolombarda he is a member of the General Council and of the Steering Committee for Foreign Multinational Companies.



JEAN PIERRE CLAMADIEU

President, ENGIE

Jean-Pierre Clamadieu is the Chairman of the Board of Directors of Engie. He was appointed in May 2018 and reelected in April 2022.

He has been CEO and Board member of Solvay between 2012 and 2019. He joined Solvay in September 2011 as member of the Executive Committee, after the acquisition of Rhodia by Solvay. Previously, he was Rhodia's Chief Executive Officer since 2003 and Chairman of the Board of Directors since 2008.

Before joining the chemical industry, he graduated from École Nationale Supérieure des Mines de Paris and had a nine-year career at the French Civil Service, namely as advisor to the Minister of Labor.

Jean-Pierre Clamadieu is Chairman of the Board of Opéra de Paris, member of the Board of Directors of Airbus and TE Connectivity. He is also Chairman of the Chamber of Commerce of Brazil in France.

He has been Board member of Axa between 2012 and 2022, President of the European Chemical Industry Council (CEFIC) between 2014 and 2016 and Board member of the International Chemical Industry Council (ICCA). Jean-Pierre Clamadieu was Chairman of the Sustainable Development Commission of MEDEF between 2007 and 2014, as well as Chairman of the Council of France-Brazil business leaders of MEDEF International and Vice-Chairman of the Executive Committee of the World Business Council for Sustainable Development.



KATIA DA ROS

Vice President Environment, Sustainability, and Culture, Confindustria

Born in Veneto, she is Vice President and CEO of Irinox SpA and President of Irinox North America, a company that manufactures rapid blast chillers and preservation systems for the professional and domestic sectors, and stainless steel switchboards.

She is Vice Chairman of the CUOA Foundation, Vice Chairman of the Northeast Advisory Board of Unicredit, Vice Chairman of the Venice Foundation, and Director of Aidaf (Italian Family Business Association).

She has held the positions of President of the Gruppo Giovani and Vice President of Unindustria Treviso and Director of QualeImpresa. She has been a member of the Ethics Committee and the Confindustria National Council, Rome.

She holds a degree in Business Administration and an Executive MBA from Harvard Business School, Boston.



ANNA FERRINO

Vice President for Sustainability, Unione Industriali Torino

Anna Beatrice Ferrino boasts a career in the textile and sports industry and in no-profit organizations.

Since 2008, she has been the CEO of Ferrino & C. Spa, previously responsible for the distribution in Italy for the American company Columbia Sportswear Company and for the textile industry Gailiard, part of the group Boussac St Freres.

In addition to her role in Ferrino & C. Spa, Anna is President of Assosport, the association of Confindustria that groups together Italian producers of sporting goods, and Vicepresident of Unioni Industriali of Turin with ESG delegation. Moreover, she is part of the Board of Directors of Aksia Group, of Fondazione Specchio dei tempi and Fondazione Cecilia Gilardi.

Among the relevant position held in the past, are highlighted the Vice presidency of Teatro Stabile of Turin, the Presidency of Formazione per l'arte moderna e contemporanea CRT, and the Vice presidency of Fondazione CRT.



GREG JACKSON

Founder & CEO, Octopus Energy

Greg Jackson is the founder of Octopus Energy Group, the global energy and technology company driving the affordable, green energy system of the future. Launched in 2016, the Group now serves 7.7 million customers across 18 countries and operates a £7bn portfolio of renewable energy assets across Europe.

Octopus drives the tech-enabled green energy transition, innovating relentlessly to make energy better for consumers and the planet. Kraken, Octopus's proprietary green tech platform, is at the heart of the Group's growth and is now contracted to serve over 54 million accounts across the globe.

Octopus has attracted over \$2.3 billion worth of funding from international energy companies, large pension funds and global investors, and has valued the company at around \$8 billion.

Greg is a serial tech entrepreneur and has built and sold a number of successful businesses before starting Octopus. He is an angel investor in a wide range of start-ups, and is a key thought leader in the UK on issues related to energy transition, energy costs and innovation.



NICOLA LANZETTA

CEO, Enel Italy

Nicola Lanzetta became the Enel Group's Head of Country Italy in December 2021. Prior to that, from 2014 he served as Head of Market Italy and was a member of Team Innovation Italy and the International Market Team which was responsible for sharing best practices between all the countries where the Group is present.

He has also served as Chairman of the Board of various Enel Group companies, including: Enel Energia S.p.A., Enel Servizio Elettrico S.p.A., EnelSi S.p.A. and Enel Sole S.p.A.

Lanzetta, who was born in 1964, has a degree in Information Technology from the University of Pisa. He is married and has two children.

He began his professional career in 1992 at AT&T/NCR Italy S.p.A. as Manager of Large Client Sales.

From 1996 he continued his career in the telecommunications sector, working for large groups such as Telecom Italia S.p.A. and Infostrada S.p.A., where he served as Director of Trade Marketing and later Director of Retail Sales.

He joined the Enel Group in 2001, first working on company integration and then on training at Enel Gas S.p.A. and later on the launch of the Enel Energia commercial network during the first phase of retail market deregulation.

His arrival coincided with a period of significant transformation: between 2006 and 2007 he led the planning, implementation and management of all commercial operations, the definition and implementation of contracts with sales partners, the management of commissioning, commercial partnerships and sales of energy products and added value services through a network of direct agents, indirect agencies, call centers, stores and the web.

He also serves as Chairman of the Energia di Assolombarda Group and is a member of the board of Confimprese.

Furthermore, he is a keynote speaker at numerous conventions and conferences and a lecturer for various university and MBA courses.



MICHAEL LEWIS

CEO, Uniper

Michael Lewis is the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Uniper SE. Düsseldorf-based Uniper is an international energy company with activities in more than 40 countries. With around 7,000 employees, it makes an important contribution to security of supply in Europe. Uniper's core businesses are power generation in Europe, global energy trading, and a broad gas portfolio. Uniper procures gas – including liquefied natural gas (LNG) – and other energy sources on global markets

The company owns and operates gas storage facilities with a capacity of more than 7 billion cubic meters. Uniper plans for its 22.5 GW of installed power-generating capacity in Europe to be carbon-neutral by 2035. The company already ranks among Europe's largest operators of hydroelectric plants and intends to further expand solar and wind energy, which are essential for a more sustainable and autonomous future.

Michael started his career in the energy industry in 1993 where he worked at Powergen plc in various technical and strategy roles. Following the acquisition of Powergen by E.ON SE in 2002, he worked in Corporate Strategy at E.ON. In 2007 he joined the management board of E.ON Climate and Renewables, and was appointed as CEO in 2015.

In 2017 he became CEO of E.ON UK, where he led the company's transformation into a leading supplier of green electricity and zero carbon energy solutions.

Apart from his position as CEO of Uniper, he is also Council Member of the Natural Environment Research Council (NERC) and a non-executive director of United Utilities plc. He was formerly a non-executive director of Equinor ASA.

He holds degrees in Engineering and Environmental Law.



EMMA MARCEGAGLIA

Chair B7 Italy

Deputy Chairman and CEO of Marcegaglia Steel and subsidiaries operating in the steel processing sector. Chairman and CEO of Marcegaglia Investments, a holding company that controls the Group's diversified activities. Marcegaglia is Italy's leading industrial group in the national and international steel sector and has been processing steel for over sixty years.

The Group - 9 billion euros in turnover, 36 plants across 4 continents, 15,000 customers and 7,500 employees - is characterised by constant growth, high quality products and processes, significant added value in the market and a strong focus on sustainability.

After graduating with honours in Business Administration from the Bocconi University in Milan, Emma Marcegaglia attended the International Management Program-Master in Business Administration at the New York University.

Alongside her constant commitment in the company, she embarked on a career path that led her to hold - in many cases, first woman in history - several important top management positions. Among the main ones are:

- President of Confindustria (2008-2012), the first woman to be elected president and the youngest in the association's then almost 100-year history (Confindustria was founded in 1910).
- President of Luiss, Libera Università Internazionale Studi Sociali Guido Carli (from 2010 to 2019, again the first woman to hold the post).
- President of Business Europe, the association representing European Business Organizations, a role she held from 2013 until 2017, renewed for two terms (the maximum possible) and the first woman to hold the position.
- President of Eni (from 2014 to 2020), appointed by the Italian government to lead a public company, the first time for a woman.
- President of the B20: appointed by the president of Confindustria in November 2020. Again, a first for a woman. In parallel with the Italian presidency of the G20 (a first for Italy), Confindustria, as the sole organizer representing Italian companies, was tasked with managing, and coordinating the G20 Business Summit (B20), the G20's most influential engagement group.

She is a member of the Executive Committee of BIAC, the OECD advisory body; deputy chairman of ISPI, Italian Institute for International Political Studies; she sits on the Board of Directors of Bracco Spa and Gabetti Property Solutions.



ROGER MARTELLA

Chief Sustainability Officer, GE Vernova

Roger Martella is GE Vernova's Chief Sustainability Officer, Head of Engagement, Government Affairs, and Policy, and Group Vice President.

In these roles, Roger engages the world's top public and private sector leaders to align GE Vernova's innovation to solve the planet's most pressing challenges of access to sustainable, reliable, and affordable energy, addressing climate change, and improving impacts to GE Vernova's people, communities, and planet. In recent years, Roger has been at the leading edge in successfully partnering the power of the private sector with the pursuits of the public sector to solve tough problems together.

Roger previously served as GE's Chief Sustainability Officer responsible for leading a comprehensive and cohesive approach to sustainability for the company. Prior to GE, Roger served as General Counsel of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, where he was unanimously confirmed by the United States Senate, and the Principal Counsel for Complex Litigation for the Department of Justice's Natural Resources Section. Roger also co-led Sidley Austin LLP's global environmental and climate change practices and was recognized among the top lawyers in the field globally.

Roger teaches a first of its kind course on International Environmental Law and Justice at Howard University Law School and serves on the Advisory Board to Harvard University's Environmental and Energy Law Program. In 2022, the Racial Justice Institute recognized Roger with a Racial Justice Champion Award. Roger is a life member of the Council on Foreign Relations and serves on the board of the Center for Climate and Energy Solutions (C2ES), the ClearPath Foundation, the Environmental Law Institute, and several environmental and energy NGOs.

Roger has co-authored and edited four books on the intersection of ESG, climate change law, international environmental law, and human rights, including Corporate Social Responsibility—Sustainable Business: Environmental, Social and Governance Frameworks for the 21st Century (Wolters Kluwer 2020). Roger is a graduate of Cornell University and holds a J.D. from Vanderbilt Law School.



RENATO MAZZONCINI

CEO & General Manager, A2A

Renato Mazzoncini, CEO and General Manager of A2A since May 2020, is an electronic engineer and professor at Politecnico di Milano.

With a career spanning strategic sectors, he led companies like Gruppo FS, Italy's national railway company.

Expert on climate change, E-Mobility, energy transformation, smart and green cities, he co-authored 'RoadMap to 2050' presented at COP 25 and in 2021, he authored "Inversione a E", on individual behaviors and technological development for sustainable mobility.

He serves as VP of Elettricità Futura, on Confindustria Brescia's General Council, Utilitalia's Listed Companies Committee, and Fondazione Politecnico di Milano's Founders' Assembly.



NICOLA MONTI

CEO, Edison

Born in Varese in 1962, he graduated in Civil Hydraulic Engineering at the Politecnico of Milan.

Appointed as Chief Executive Officer of Edison Spa in July 2019, Nicola Monti led the company in the restructuring of its industrial portfolio in line with the sustainable challenges of the energy sector, through the exit from the Exploration & Production business, the diversification of the gas supply sources, the growth of renewable production and the strengthening of energy sales and services.

He reinforced the ESG governance with a renewed commitment to the objectives of the United Nations Agenda and promoted the establishment of Edison Orizzonti Sociali (EOS), a non-profit foundation active in educational projects for young people of which he is President. He also chairs the Edison Foundation, one of the most influential economic research centers in Italy and is a member of various national and international associations.

He joined Edison in 2000 as head of international development. In 2012 he assumed the position of Executive Vice President of the Exploration & Production Division and in 2017 he also led the Power Asset and Engineering Division of Edison.

In 1999 he was Key Account Manager in the International Division of Pirelli Cables & Systems.

From 1996 to 1998 he was Regional Manager for Southeast Asia, based in Indonesia and Thailand, for Ansaldo Energia.

From 1989 to 1995 he worked at Snam, holding various positions in the International Division including that of resident area manager in Argentina from 1990 to 1993.

- In the XVIII legislature (2018) elected to the Senate of the Republic where he served as treasurer of the Forza Italia Berlusconi Presidente-UDC Group and Group Leader for Forza Italia in the Budget Committee.
- On March 1, 2021, he was appointed Undersecretary of State at the Ministry of Economic Development in the Draghi government and later promoted to Deputy Minister in April 2021.
- In May 2021, he was appointed President of the National Council of Consumers and Users, and in July 2022, he was designated a member of the National Observatory for the Integration of Gender Equality Policies by the Minister of Economic Development representing the Ministry itself.
- Currently serving as Minister of Environment and Energy Security in the Meloni government since October 2022.

Lorenzo Simonelli is Chairman and CEO of Baker Hughes (NASDAQ:BKR). Baker Hughes is an energy technology company that combines innovation, expertise and scale to provide solutions for energy and industrial customers worldwide.

Simonelli was named Chairman of the Board in October 2017 and has been President and CEO since the Company's creation in 2017, where he oversaw the successful merger of GE Oil & Gas with Baker Hughes Inc. Since 2013, he served as President and CEO of GE Oil & Gas.

Previously, Simonelli served as President and CEO of GE Transportation, a global transportation leader in the rail, mining, marine and energy storage industries. During his five-year tenure, he expanded and diversified GE Transportation by focusing on advanced technology manufacturing, intelligent control systems, and a diverse approach to new propulsion solutions.

He has also served as CFO Americas for GE Consumer & Industrial, as well as General Manager, Product Management for GE Appliances, Lighting, Electrical Distribution and Motors.

Simonelli joined GE's Financial Management Program in 1994, where he worked on assignments in GE International, GE Shared Services, GE Oil & Gas, and Consolidated Financial Insurance.

He currently serves on the Board of Iveco Group N.V. He served on the Board of C3.ai, Inc. from 2020-2021 and on the Board of CNH Industrial N.V. from 2019-2021.

MARK WIEDMAN
