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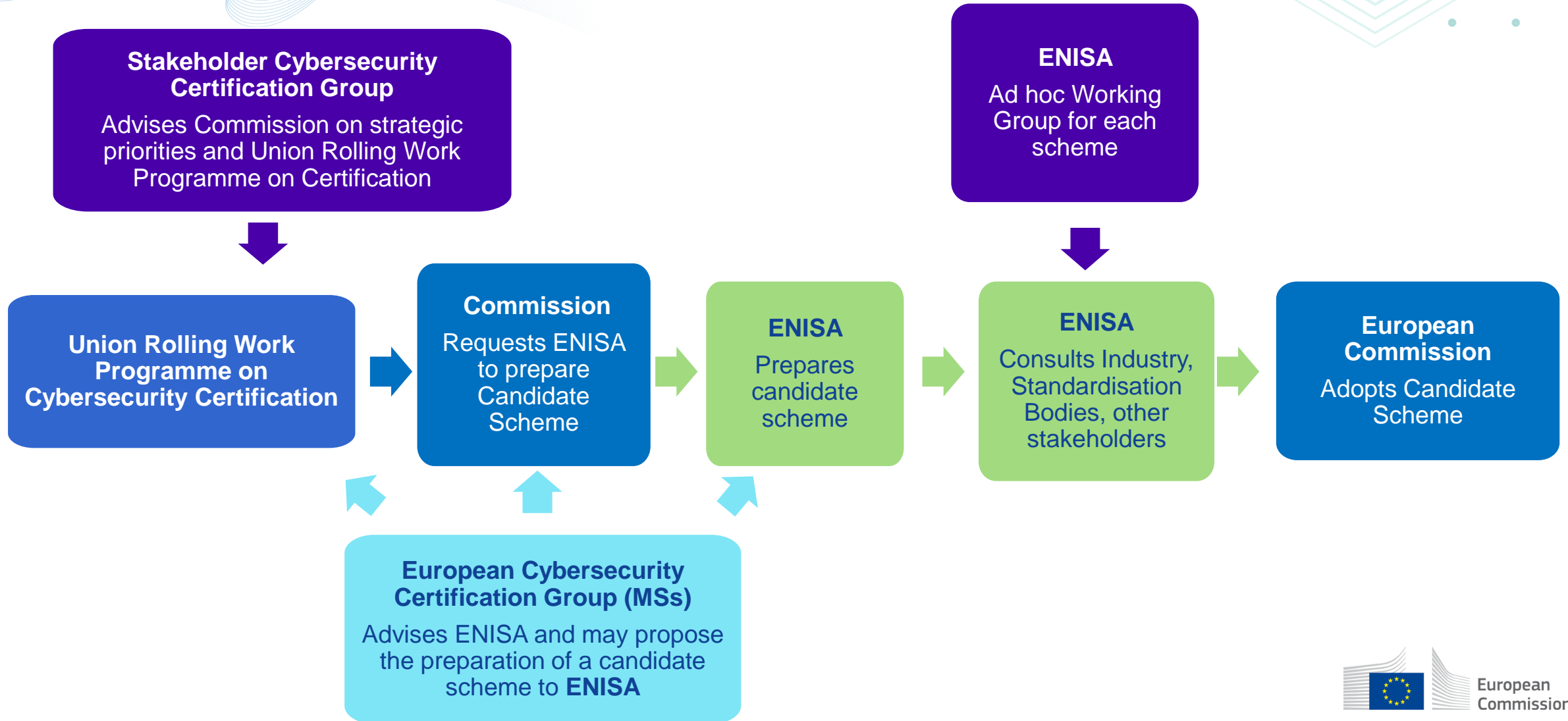

Union Rolling Work Programme for European cybersecurity certification

- Publication 2021

Union Rolling Work Programme for European cybersecurity certification

- Identifies strategic priorities for future European cybersecurity certification schemes;
- Multi-annual document to be drafted by the Commission with inputs from SCCG and ECCG and other stakeholders;
- Cybersecurity Strategy stated that the URWP should be adopted in early 2021;
- It shall be updated at least once every three years and more often if necessary.

Inclusion in the Union Rolling Work Programme

- Availability and development of national cybersecurity certification schemes;
- Relevant Union or Member State law or policy;
- Market demand;
- Developments in the cyber threat landscape;
- Request of a candidate scheme by ECCG.

Consultations on draft Union Rolling Work Programme

- The Commission to take due account of the comments and Opinions of the SCCG and the ECCG on the Food for Thought paper and draft URWP.
- Feedback sought on:
 - Strategic priorities;
 - Future candidate schemes;
 - Areas for future reflection.

Strategic Priorities for European cybersecurity certification

- Standardisation;
- Security by design;
- Risk-based approach;
- Coherence (horizontal and vertical requirements);
- International cooperation;
- Measurement of scheme efficiency.

Possible candidate schemes & Areas for future reflection

- Ground(s) for inclusion in URWP;
- Internet of Things; Industrial Automation Control Systems;
- Lightweight Evaluation;
- Secure Development Lifecycle (SDL);
- Artificial Intelligence;
- Cryptographic mechanisms;
- Security audit service providers.

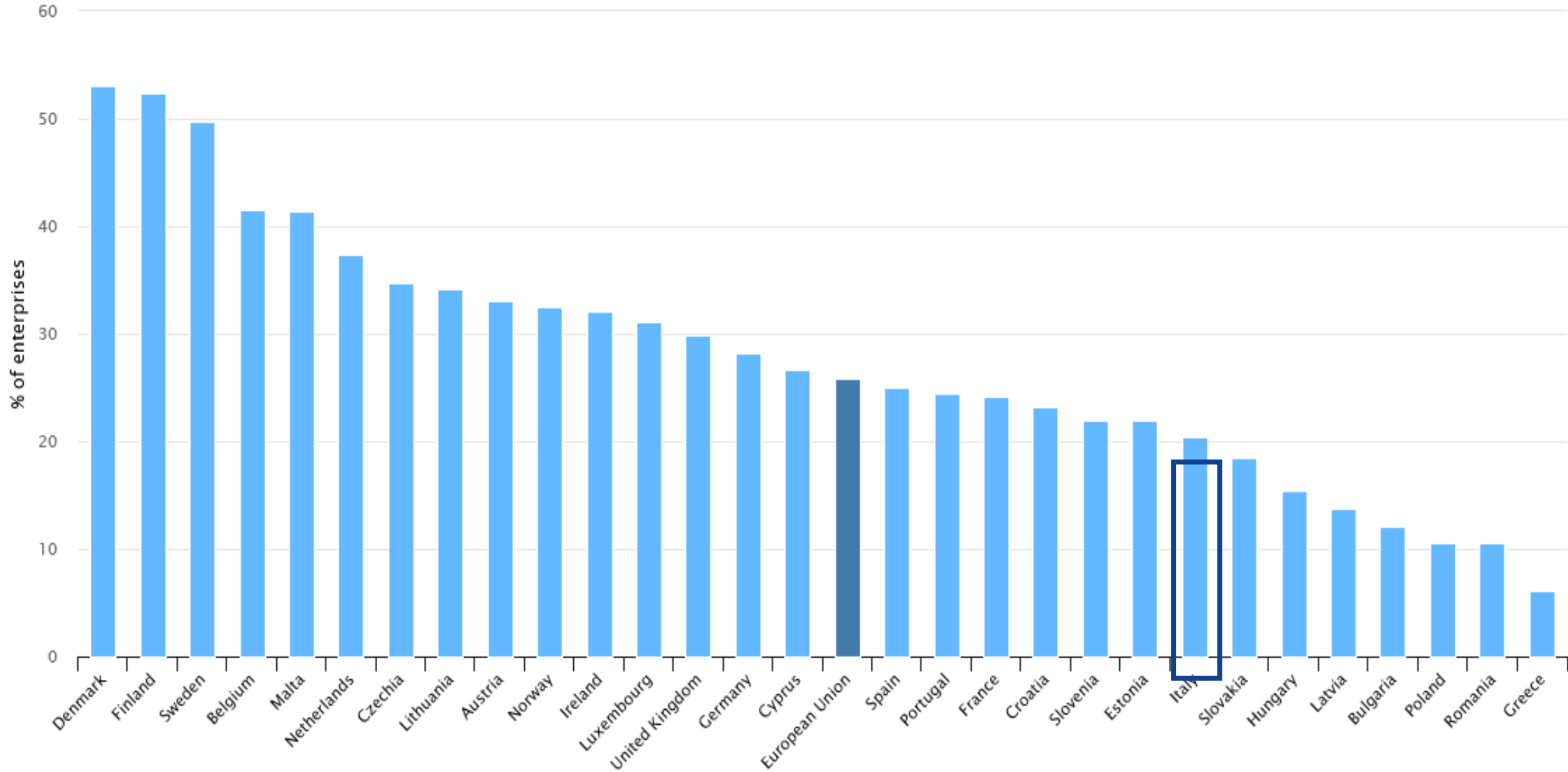
To help businesses big and small to harness the full potential of AI, we will invest in a network of local digital innovation hubs and in centres of excellence for advanced research and educationn.

Enterprises with High levels of Digital Intensity

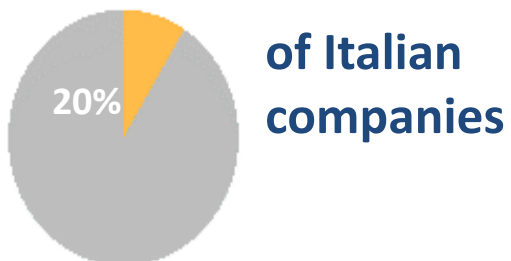

Highly digitised companies across Europe (2019)

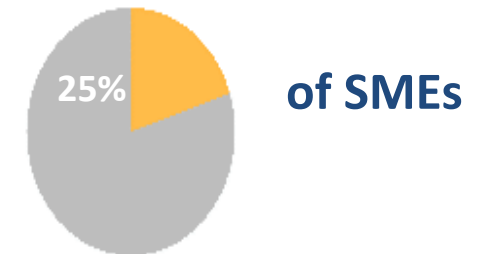

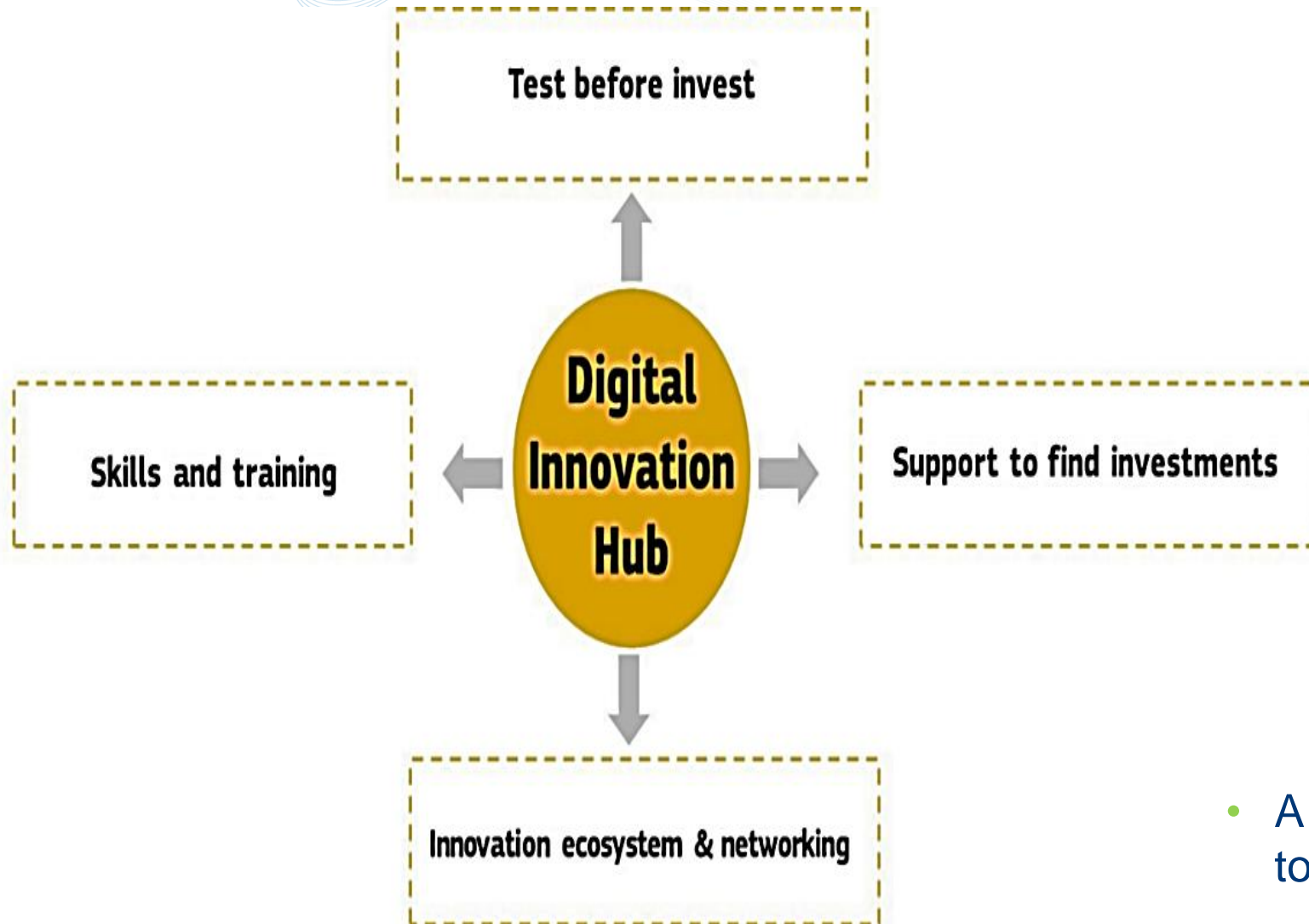

Digital Innovation Hubs in Horizon 2020

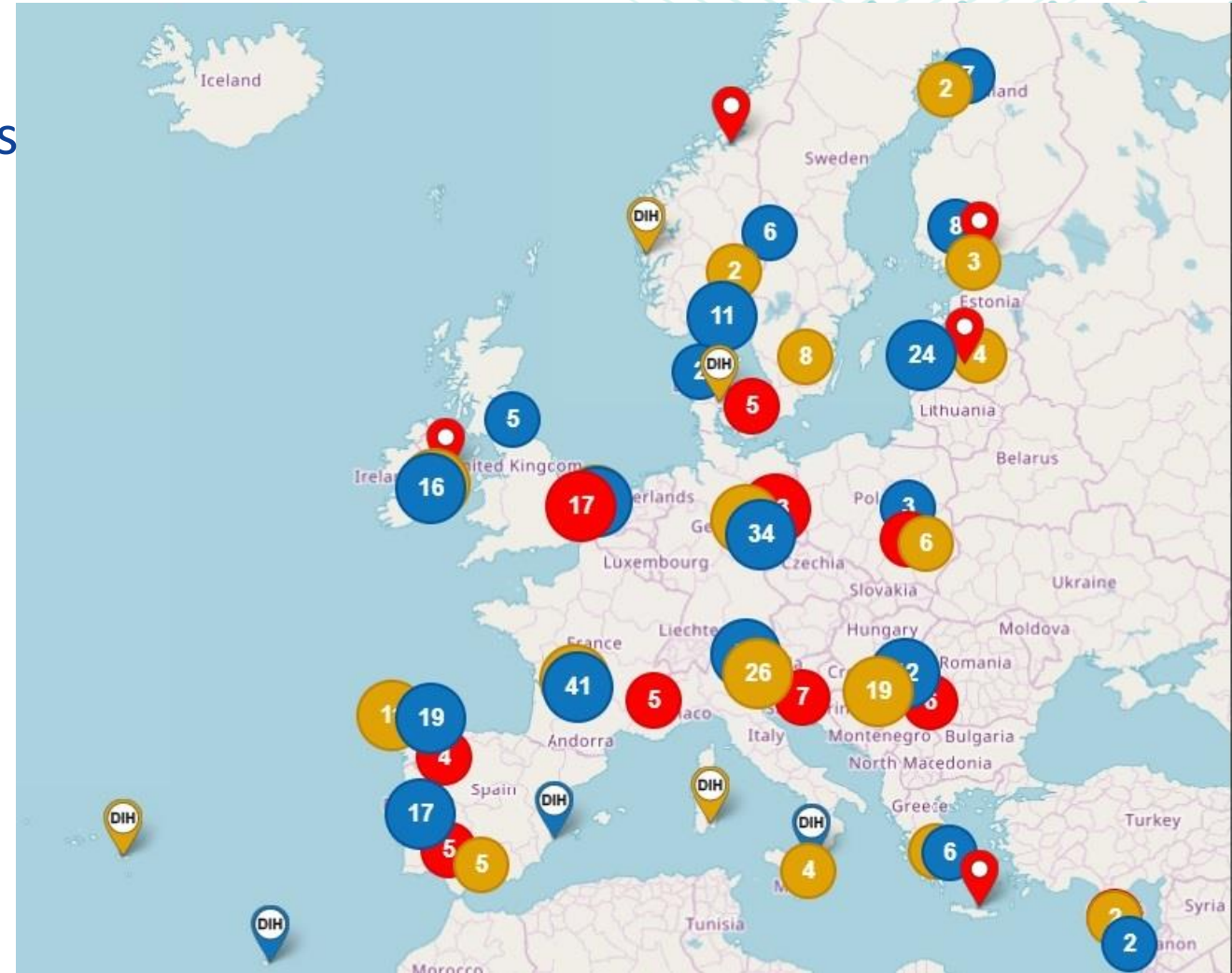
- Support to more than 2000 Start-ups, SMEs to test digital innovations

- Co-funding from Member States

Digital Transformation Accelerator

- Next order of magnitude as the EDIH network gets larger
- To promote a well-structured European network
