# **Union Rolling Work Programme for European cybersecurity certification**

- Identifies strategic priorities for future European cybersecurity certification schemes;
- Multi-annual document to be drafted by the Commission with inputs from SCCG and ECCG and other stakeholders;
- Cybersecurity Strategy stated that the URWP should be adopted in early 2021;
- It shall be updated at least once every three years and more often if necessary.



# **Inclusion in the Union Rolling Work Programme**

- Availability and development of national cybersecurity certification schemes;
- Relevant Union or Member State law or policy;
- Market demand;
- Developments in the cyber threat landscape;
- Request of a candidate scheme by ECCG.




#### Enterprises with High levels of Digital Intensity

Year:2019


